City of Houston trash service notes



- We recommend downloading the City of Houston free app HTX Collects for your phone or tablet. Alerts will let you know if pickup is delayed or the schedule has changed for all pickups - including monthly tree and/or junk waste.

- Trash pickup is weekly on Thursdays, must fit in the 96 gallon City provided bin - a second bin can be purchased if needed via 311.

- Recycles every other Thursday, in City provided bin, taking cardboard, glass, and coded plastics except #6. No plastic bags! Follow the directions on the bin lid!

- Yard waste only in City approved compostable bags on trash days - available at local stores - branches can be bundled also, 4 feet in length, 18 inches diameter, 50 pound limit

- Tree waste pickup is monthly on the 2nd Wednesday. Even numbered months include junk waste.

- Bins must be placed at the curb the night before or the day of pickup, with the arrow on the lid pointed toward the street, and nothing within three feet of either side of the bin.

- Please do not leave any bags along the side of city bins other than approved yard waste bags - they will not be picked up. Do not pile items outside of the bins. Do not overfill the bins.

- Please remember to store your bins out of public view when not out for pickup - the whole street looks much nicer when we are not looking at dozens of bins in front of houses!

- Please do not leave junk waste piled in front of your house weeks in advance of scheduled pickup. Contractors should remove any refuse they created.

Spring cleaning recommendations

This is the perfect time of year to start working on your home's exterior repairs and maintenance needs. Cleaning the mildew from your home, repainting, and replacing rotten or damaged wood will enhance your home and protect it from further damage.

CMSI will be conducting comprehensive mildew/paint inspections beginning in April. Spring is also a great time to re-assess your yard maintenance schedule and maybe even plant some colorful flowers.

Clean the curb in front of your house!

Grass clippings, leaves, dirt runoff, and trash can accumulate along the curb in front of your house. This can lead to water not draining properly during heavy rains. Drains are not leaf and yard clippings receptacles! Please clean your curbs and make sure yard work or yard services don't block water flow or drains that can keep our streets clear!

If you see something, say something!

Results of the Annual Meeting

First assessment increase in several years

The annual meeting was held in October. George Brownfield was reelected to a three year term. The annual assessment was set at \$275. A balanced budget was reviewed by the assembled homeowners. Twice a month neighborhood inspections will be funded by the higher assessment rate.

All residents are invited to attend meetings of the Association, either to observe or to bring up a specific topic. Standard meetings are on the third Monday of the month, at Williams Recreation Center, 15000 McConn Street, starting at 7 p.m. Signs are posted for the monthly meeting at both entrances to the neighborhood.

Where do your fees go?

Contract security, landscape service, electricity and water for the park, mosquito spraying, general repairs, CPA, committees, bad debt, insurance, legal fees and the management company. Come to a meeting to review all details of our balanced, public budget.

Taking a walk? Help clean as you go!

A suggestion at a previous meeting was to take a plastic bag with you and pick up any loose trash as you walk. It's an easy idea to help our neighborhood look better! We are always looking for new ideas from our residents - let us hear from you!

Walking your dog? Please pick up after it!

Homeowners are noting "presents" left behind, not only in their yard, but especially at the park off the trails. Our kids and families play there, so please, wherever your dog "goes", please clean up!

More park improvements planned for 2025
